We are having fun! We have learned the letters I, Z, S and began reviewing concepts such as rhyming, and identifying vowels inside of words. We have also introduced blending consonant sounds (diagraphs) like “ch,” “br,” and “sh.” Students did an awesome job!!

We have learned about squirrels, insects, rats, and life cycles. We have even learned that a **zorillo** is an African skunk! Students loved learning about what rats eat and that every rat can swim. We also discussed the Susquehanna River, learning that it is the longest river on the east coast. We have witnessed butterflies and quail hatch, helping us to understand their life cycles. We have talked more about what plants need to grow, discussing soil nutrients, and transplanting our tomatoes that we started from seed weeks ago.

We have really enjoyed observing the seasonal changes taking place in the park. We continue to see more robins, hear more song birds singing, and even got to see a herd of deer. We have been searching for insects and found an “ant party,” remnants of honey comb, and numerous centipedes.
